



What is a Safeguarding Adults Board (SAB)?

Who we are

Each SAB has the strategic lead for Safeguarding Adults in their area.

It is comprised of an Independent Chair, the Local Authority, Integrated Care Board, Police, and a range of other agencies.

What we do

We have three statutory duties: to have a strategic plan; produce an annual report, and to carry out Safeguarding Adults Reviews (SARs).

We look at Safeguarding activity to understand and anticipate risk, undertake assurance work to look at areas for improvement, and produce learning aids to take forward recommendations from SARs. SABs publish these, alongside safeguarding policies and procedures you should be working to, and details of priorities for the year.
