READING—A BIG SUCCESS STORY

Progress across the school is Outstanding with 100% of our pupils achieving the national standard of level 4 or more and 100% of our pupils making the expected progress measure. Of these 50% made more than expected progress. In KS1 pupils are making great progress and we are now outper-

forming the national picture at all stages of learning.

Carefully taught reading during Guided Reading. Targeted Booster sessions for ability groups in



upper Key Stage 2.

Parent training and guidance sessions.

Our constant high expectations and relentless focus on reading across the school at all levels.
