

Working with and supporting parents and carers of children affected by CSE

Parents as partners in tackling child sexual exploitation:

A one day course that looks at the impact that CSE has on parents and carers and the family, and the specific support needs that they have as a result. It also explores the important role parents and carers can have, if supported, in helping to tackle this crime along with elements of good practice for practitioners working with families.

Target audience: Practitioners who come into contact with parents and carers whose children are- or are at risk of being- sexually exploited. This includes statutory workers such as the police, social care, health practitioners and voluntary sector employees and volunteers. It is for people who have basic knowledge of CSE and some experience of working in this field.

Aims: To look at the impact of CSE on the family and explore effective methods of working with and supporting parents/carers affected by CSE, to help safeguard the child or young person.

Learning Outcomes: By the end of the session the learner will:

- Understand the impact of CSE on families.
- Identify specific support needs of affected parents and carers.
- Recognise elements of good practice for effective support.
- Identify the benefits of a child and family centred approach to CSE.
- Appreciate the importance of including parents and carers as partners in tackling CSE.
