



YOU HAVE THE POWER TO HELP PREVENT CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION AND TRAFFICKING

Child Sexual Exploitation involves young people under the age of 18 who are coerced or forced into a sexual relationship or situation by another person, in exchange for something.

HOUSEKEEPING - WHAT TO LOOK OUT FOR:

- **Signs of alcohol, drug or substance misuse - lots of condom wrappers, drug and drug supplies like syringes, pipes, spoons/cookers, antiseptic wipes, prescription or over the counter drugs.**
- **Guests who appear secretive about their activities or who try to conceal their activities in their room**
- **Multiple visitors to a room**
- **Signs of extreme sexual activity in the room**
- **Guests who do not want their rooms cleaned**
- **Room service - alcohol orders to rooms where you perceive guests to be under age.**

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SUSPECT SOMETHING:

- **Speak to your Supervisor or Manager**
- **Make a note of any suspicious people, activity or vehicles**
- **Your managers might need to consider sealing off the hotel room. If so, do not move or clean anything until the Police arrive.**
