**NOTICE** is hereby given that West Sussex County Council propose to make a permanent Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to introduce lengths of prohibition of waiting at all times (double yellow lines) on sections of both sides of Byron Close, Park Way, Chaucer Road and Wordsworth Close.

The consultation for this proposal will start on 29 July 2020 and, AT THAT TIME, full details of the proposal in this Notice can be viewed on our website [www.westsussex.gov.uk/tro](http://www.westsussex.gov.uk/tro). The website includes a response form for comments or objections.

**STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING TO MAKE THE ORDER**

The County Council in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, propose to introduce a permanent Order the effect of which will be to introduce lengths of prohibition of waiting at all times (double yellow lines) on sections of both sides of Byron Close, Park Way, Chaucer Road and Wordsworth Close.

Local residents have reported numerous incidences of inconsiderate parking in Byron Close and at other nearby junctions restricting access and visibility for traffic entering and leaving the roads making them unsafe for both drivers and pedestrians. There have also been incidences of parked vehicles obstructing private driveways and there is evidence of damaged grass verges in Byron Close and Wordsworth Close.

Crawley County Local Committee approved progression of a TRO to resolve these issues.

In Byron Close & Wordsworth Close vehicles are routinely parking in close proximity to private driveways and at the junction of Byron Close and St Marys Drive so as to obstruct visibility and affect the free flow of traffic. Reports indicate that drivers and pedestrians have difficulty accessing the road with poor forward visibility due to parked cars.

In Chaucer Road vehicles are parking in close proximity to the junction of Chaucer Road and Park Way so as to obstruct visibility and affect the free flow of traffic. Reports indicate that drivers and pedestrians have difficulty negotiating the road junctions with poor forward visibility due to parked cars.

In Park Way vehicles are routinely parking in close proximity to a driveway outside No.19 so as to obstruct visibility and affect the free flow of traffic.

The introduction of Double Yellow lines (DYLs) will deter parking on or near these junctions, prevent verge and footway parking and will reinforce Section 243 of the Highway Code. It will make it easier for pedestrians to cross the road safely and encourage drivers to park in safer locations with consideration for other drivers, pedestrians and school pupils in residential neighbourhoods close to Three Bridges Station.

This Order is proposed for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, for preventing damage to the road or any other building on or near the road and for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians).
