Description

Lynchets or cultivation terraces on the hillslope known as Vineyard Hill are characteristic of EIA and Roman period.<1><2>
Ploughed out by 1970.<3>

Ploughed-out field system. Early 20th century map evidence indicates that two long rectangular plots were aligned along Vineyard Hill, terminating in a transverse lynchet situated just to the north of, and parallel to the trackway. This transverse lynchet is still visible as an ephemeral feature 0.5m high, with a suggestion of a longitudinal break of slope visible on its western side. {4}

Description

Two early C2 cremation burials were discovered at a depth of 2ft, in the summer of 1968, on Worthing Golf Course, by contractors digging a trench for a water pipe to the 7th green. The findspot was described by Dr Densham, who visited the site at the time and took measurements, as being 17ft W of the W side of the green and 11ft W of the end of the water pipe trench. From ground inspection this is at TQ14300703. The urns, of grey ware containing burnt bones, were broken by the workmen, but have been restored by Dr Densham, who retains them together with a poppy head beaker and some samian ware which accompanied the burials. 50ft W of the cremations, at TQ14280703, in the same trench, two adult inhumations were found, together with a sherd of grey ware dating them to the Roman period. They are also with Dr Densham.<1>

In Lewes and Liverpool Museums.<1> A Palaeolithic axe from Cissbury advertised for sale by Fox and Co., of 30 Princes Street, Yeovil, Somerset. Length 140mm. Described as Lower Palaeolithic Middle Acheulian white flint, ovate with traces of secondary bar hammer flaking, chip to edge revealing a black flint. (Sounds rather Neolithic).<2>

Cissbury Ring hillfort (see 4281) probably went out of use in C1BC. The site was cultivated from then into the Roman period, resulting in the build up of lynchets and a field system.{1}{2}{3}

Cissbury Ring is a univallate Iron Age hillfort enclosing over 15 acres. {1}

Excavations by the Worthing Archaeological Society in 1930 suggest that it was constructed in La Tene I and became disused in C1BC.{2}{3}{4}

Enclosures within the fort have been surveyed which may be of different periods, as well as a series of pits. Finds are in Brighton, Worthing and Pitt Rivers Museums.{5}{6}

Ploughing during the war reduced many of the internal features but some were still visible in 1971.{7}

Schedule Entry: The monument includes a large univallate hillfort and its associated field systems dating to the Iron Age and Roman period (c.400 BC-AD 450), an earlier prehistoric flint mine, a Bronze Age bowl Barrow, traces of later medieval cultivation, a post-medieval beacon, a Napoleonic advanced infantry post and a World War II anti-aircraft gun position. These survive in earthwork and buried form and are situated on clay-with-flints capped chalk spur which projects from the southern edge of the Sussex Downs, c.3km north of the Channel coast at Worthing. This location commands extensive views across the coastal plain to the south and the lowland and Weald to the north. Part excavation carried out during the 19th and early 20th Centuries has indicated that the hillfort was constructed during the Middle Iron Age (c.400 BC). The north east-south west aligned, roughly oval fort covers an area of c.24ha, and its defences survive in the form of a bank measuring from 1.3m to 3.9m high and c.4m wide, a ditch and counterscarp bank. The bank is largest on the defensively vulnerable south eastern side, where the surrounding ground slopes away more gradually. Surrounding the bank is a steeply-faced, flat-bottomed ditch c.5m wide and c.2m deep, edged by a counterscarp bank up to 3m wide and 1.5m high. The ramparts have been disturbed in places by later paths, concrete steps and tracks, and a concrete building foundation located in the ditch to the north west is associated with modern reuse of the hillfort during World War II. The fort was entered by two gateways to the south and east, indicated by causeways over the ditch and gaps in the ramparts, measuring 4m and 1.5m high, flanked by raised, interned bank terminals. Ranging over the south western portion of the hillfort and down the slope to the south and west of the ramparts, the earlier Neolithic flint mines has been partly disturbed by the subsequent construction of the hillfort and its later uses. The mines survive as a group of at least 270 roughly circular hollows ranging from 3m to 36m in diameter and up to 3m deep. A recent earthwork survey has produced the first detailed plan of the extensive Neolithic flint mining complex set within the context of the hillfort; new information concerning the earthworks within the interior of the hillfort has also been recorded. {12}

Geophysical survey in April 2000 revealed little of archaeological significance beyond that already known. The investigation of the interanal area of the hillfort was hampered by surface vegetation and ferrous disturbance probably resulting from 20th Century military activity. Potentially of most archaeological interest are a series of positive magnetic anomalies along the line of the northern rampart that possibly indicate past burning of this structure. Pits and some linear features were also detected within the hillfort. More limited earth resistance survey at Cissbury confirmed the outline of extant earthworks and added further detail to their plans. The clay-with-flints deposits on the higher parts of the hilltop have been defined by both surveys as an area of increased magnetic disturbance and reduced electrical resistance. {13}

This survey involved a comprehensive review of existing primary and secondary historical and archaeological sources and a landscape survey to identify and record features of archaeological significance within the property and its immediate environs. Each archaeological feature is described and photographed and a statement of its current condition made. {14}

There is a suggested early 11th century burh at Cissbury Hillfort evidenced by the mint-name Sithesteb(urh) of the closing years of the reign of Ethelred II and beginning of the reign of Cnut (when the mint was relocated to Steyning). {15}

Hill is 'slightly unhappy' about the identification of Cissbury. {16}

A Topographical and Geophysical survey was undertaken outside the eastern entrance of Cissbury Ring Hillfort. The survey results have resulted in a better understanding of the eastern entrance and have highlighted areas that should be avoided when planning the position of a water trough and any associated pipeline routes. The presence of archaeological anomalies associated with the tumulus (SAM 27069) provide evidence for the success of the method over the chalk geology. The origin of some of the earthworks has been called into question, but without further detailed survey into adjacent areas (probably with some vegetation clearance) the question of the origin of these earthworks is uncertain. What is clear is that there are two separate ditches running parallel with one another and a modification to the western edge of one of them to create a scarp face with the faint counterscarp. It should also be stated that although the earthworks may be related to the trackway they also mirror the orientation of the hillfort ramparts. {17}

The hillfort forms the main focus of the property and occupies a prominent spur on the northern scarp of the secondary escarpment of the South Downs. The plateau occupied by the hillfort reaches a maximum elevation of 184mOD, and slopes gently to the south-west. The remainder of the property outside the hillfort largely comprises steep scarp slopes, that on the north-east are thickly covered in scrub woodland, while the others are mainly open grassland with scattered scrub in places particularly on the south ridge.

A plantation of 19th century origin, Cissbury Plantation, flanks the south gate of the fort while the southern boundary crosses two dry valleys, including the aptly named Deep Bottom. The current land-use within the property is unimproved grassland and scrub woodland, managed principally by the National Trust for its archaeology, nature conservation and landscape value. Public access is open within the National Trust boundary with good public footpath coverage beyond.

The most recent being an archaeological and historic landscape survey of the area of Cissbury Ring, which was carried out June 2006 in order to produce a comprehensive archaeological and historical land-use statement of the whole of the property and its environs to inform any future management plan revisions or conservation plan proposals. The report comprises the archaeological detail of the hillfort and a huge number of other archaeological elements of significance such as Neolithic Flint Mines, Late Iron Age/Romano-British field systems and Second World War military sites. {18}

They survive as an area of depressions of varying shape and depth marking the sites of shafts, and spoilheaps.{4}

For the Iron Age hillfort see 4281. A site visit in October 1985-86 showed that some of the surface undulations relating to the flint mines themselves are suffering from erosion where paths used by visitors cross them.{5}

In 1994 the area was resurveyed using a Wild TC2000 Total Station and GRE3 datalogger. {6}

Ranging over the south western portion of the hillfort and down the slope to the south and west of the ramparts, the earlier Neolithic flint mine has been partly disturbed by the subsequent construction of the hillfort and its later uses. The mines survive as a group of at least 270 roughly circular hollows ranging from 3m to 36m in diameter and up to 3m deep. These have been shown by part excavation to be the partly infilled remains of shafts dug into the ground to reach the underlying seams of flint. The excavations revealed that horizontal galleries radiating from the main vertical shafts had been dug in order to follow the flint seams. The shafts are surrounded by irregular dumped spoil heaps up to c.3.5m high, and smaller mounds and hollows will represent flint working areas. Struck flint flakes have been noted around some of the shaft heads.{7}

A carved post-medieval gaming counter was 'found' in the hands of a skeleton at Cissbury, which is thought to be a fake, as well as some deer engravings from the walls of a cissbury shaft, the discovery of which is suspicious. {8}{9}

A complex group of c.270 circular hollows and associated spoil heaps, ranging from 3-36m in diameter and up to 3m deep. They are most prominent along the north-western crest of the hill, but are visible for up to 250m to the east gradually becoming more ephemeral. Additional spoil heaps are also visible outside the later hillfort defences on the western side of the hill. This collection of mines include Lane Fox's Pit, Tindall's Pit, Willett's Pit, Park Harrison's Pit and a former flint mine which is part of a field system. {10}

The mines survive as a group of at least 270 roughly circular hollows ranging from 3m to 36m in diameter and up to 3m deep. These have been shown by part excavation to be the partly infilled remains of shafts dug into the ground to reach the underlying seams of flint. The excavations revealed that horizontal galleries radiating from the main vertical shafts had been dug in order to follow the flint seams. The shafts are surrounded by irregular dumped spoil heaps up to c.3.5m high, and smaller mounds and hollows will represent flint working areas. Struck flint flakes have been noted around some of the shaft heads.{7}

A carved post-medieval gaming counter was 'found' in the hands of a skeleton at Cissbury, which is thought to be a fake, as well as some deer engravings from the walls of a cissbury shaft, the discovery of which is suspicious. {8}{9}

An extension of the flint mine group appears on the southern ridge beyond the ramparts, these are smaller and less prominent than those inside the hillfort appearing to have suffered damage from later ploughing. This collection of mine pits include Lane Fox's Pits, and Pull's Pits. {10}
