<p>Item 4.</p> <p><a href="#">Panel Questions to the Commissioner</a></p>	<p>1)</p> <p>The Commissioner agreed to, at the next Panel meeting, provide an update on the effectiveness of the new Operation Crackdown website since it launched at the end of 2022.</p>	<p>OSPCC</p>	<p>Operation Crackdown was formally relaunched in December 2022 and now has enhanced capabilities to receive reports of anti-social driving, including the submission of supporting digital evidence.</p> <p>The most significant improvements relate to the use of NICE as the Digital Evidence Management System. This makes the system more user friendly and simplistic for individuals to submit corroborative reports and digital evidence. Previously, members of the public were using other platforms, including YouTube and Dropbox, to upload images and supporting evidence before submitting links to Sussex Police via the Operation Crackdown website.</p> <p>Sussex Police has also invested additional capacity in Operation Crackdown to ensure that the website can manage the anticipated increase in digital evidence in both an efficient and effective manner. Initial evidence suggests that the improvements made to the website are already contributing to an increased number of reports being made through the site / positive action taken by the police.</p> <p>It is recognised that the improvements made to Operation Crackdown are still relatively new and that further work is required to educate users on the most effective digital evidence to submit through this system to contribute positively towards a reduction in the number of individuals killed or seriously injured on the roads in Sussex.</p> <p>Further information about the improvements made and the ability to upload corroborative evidence can be viewed through the following link: <a href="https://reports.operationcrackdown.org/asdprs/">https://reports.operationcrackdown.org/asdprs/</a></p> <p style="text-align: right;"><b>COMPLETED.</b></p>
