What is the National Highway and Transport Public Satisfaction (NHT) Survey?

- The survey is a random postal survey that asks the public for their perceptions on, and satisfaction with, highways and transport services within the county
- 3,300 households in West Sussex were asked to participate
 - 887 public responses (26.9% response rate, down
 1.8% compared to last year, national average 22.8%)
- The results of the survey allow for comparison with the other 110 authorities taking part over the country

How are the results collected and interpreted?

- West Sussex had 887 households respond, comprising of 149 online responses and 738 postal responses
- The majority of questions are answered on a 5point or 4-point scale and a score is allocated, an example is below;
 - very satisfied (100)
 - fairly satisfied (75)
 - neither/nor (50)
 - fairly dissatisfied (25)
 - very dissatisfied (o)

- The scores are then calculated by taking an average of all the responses received to each question
- This method of calculating the scores is consistent amongst all the authorities taking part in the survey
- The survey captures the insights of West Sussex residents between 13th June 2022 and 22nd August 2022.



How West Sussex are doing compared to neighbouring authorities?

- Compared amongst the 7 South East County Councils, West Sussex are rated 47 for Overall theme score, which is towards the lower scoring of the local councils
- Each of the authorities are scoring marginally below the nationwide survey average, with the exception of Hampshire
- The West Sussex score is also slightly below the average score for County Council authorities nationwide which is 49

Note: The Overall theme score is calculated from the Key Benchmark Indicators oo (overall satisfaction), o1 and o2 (importance vs satisfaction).







Road Condition Information

A Roads

- Percentage of 'Green' rated A roads is 69%, 0.8% up on last year, the first rise 6 years
- Percentage of 'Red' rated A roads has remained broadly the same as the previous year




B Roads


- Percentage of 'Green' rated B roads is 71.5%, down 0.4% on last year
- Percentage of 'Red' rated B roads
 has risen 0.3% to 4.7%

C Roads

- Percentage of 'Green' rated C roads is 66.3%, up 1.4% on last year
- Percentage of **`Red**' rated C roads has decreased by 0.3% to 6.4%

Summary

- Public Transport is perceived as a positive aspect by the public and is in line with the national average, despite scores decreasing from last year
- Highway Maintenance has improved since last year and the condition and safety of roads remains a priority for members of the public
- Overall the majority of scores have decreased since last year and West Sussex are one of the lower scoring local county councils
- Scores for local councils across the country have been decreasing over the last few years
- The number of above average scores for WS has decreased and the number of below average scores has increased since last year across the survey
