It says what we do with your personal information when you use Early Help services.

This information is also called **personal** data.



Personal information like your name, age and address helps us run services better.



This paper explains:

how we use your information



what we use it for



who we can share it with



why we need to share it



how long we keep your information for.

Different types of information



We keep personal information like your:

name



age



address



phone number



date of birth



gender.



We might also keep special information like your:

ethnicity



disability



why you need support



how we plan to support you



which of our services you use.



Sometimes we also need personal information from organisations like:

 health and care organisations that support you



 children's services that have supported you in the past



your local council



the police



schools or education services

What the law says



The law says how organisations like the County Council must deal with personal information.



We must make sure your information is:

correct



used properly



kept safely



only kept for as long as we need it.



The law says we can only keep personal information if we need it to:

support you properly



 keep to the law and stop crimes happening



protect someone's life



provide safe health and care services.

How we use your personal information



We will use your information to help us:

 make sure you and your child have the right support



 find out what support people in different areas need



train our staff



look into complaints



tell you about our services



make sure we spend public money properly.



We only keep your information for as long as we need to use it.



We will not keep it for more than 25 years.

Who we share your information with



We keep your information private.



We only share it with other people if:

 you might be a danger to yourself or someone else



• the law says we must share the information with another organisation.



This includes:

 other council teams and health and care services



children's services and schools



 services like doctors or housing who sign our agreement about sharing information



Government organisations



 organisations like Ofsted that check children's services



 the police or other organisations that look into crime.



We will never give your information to people who want to sell you things.

Your rights



You can ask us to:

show you information we have about you



 give you copies of this information to use with other services



change this information if it is not correct



 get rid of information if we are no longer using it or you think we have used it in the wrong way. We might not agree to this



If you have a service from us you need to know we might have to keep some of your information on our records, even if you want it deleted.

Complaints



If you complain about the County Council or another organisation we will:

 use your information to look into the complaint



 say who you are if you complain about another organisation or service. It might be difficult to look into things if you do not want us to say who you are



• if you complain for someone else we will check who you are and if they want you to do this.



You can complain if you are not happy with how we use or keep your information.

But please talk to us first and give us a chance to sort things out.

What the words mean

Ethnicity – the language, religion and customs of people who come from an area or country.

Gender – whether someone thinks of themself as a man, a woman or in some other way.

Information Commissioner's Office – a public organisation that makes sure organisations keep to the law when they use and store personal information.

Ofsted – an organisation that checks schools and colleges for people of all ages and services that care for children and young people.

Personal data - personal information like your name, age, address, gender or ethnicity.
