# Who can have an Independent Visitor (IV)?

#### YOU can....

- if you are looked after and aren't going to be living with your family
- if you are between 8 and 17 years old
- if you don't have much contact with your family

#### So what does an IV do?

- visits you regularly
- has fun with you doing things you choose
- can advise you and help you speak up if you need support

takes you out



### So, who are IV's?

- they aren't social workers or foster carers or keyworkers
- they're volunteers who want to help you get the best out of life and have fun
- they're adults who are safe to be with and are good listeners

## What can you do with your IV?

You both decide. For example, going to the cinema or a museum, having a chat and a hot chocolate, walking on the beach, reading, having a bike ride – it's up to the two of you. "We have a chat about how things are, then we go bowling or to the cinema..."
