<p>Lower lane in West Burton is frequently flooded. The water sits on the road and is extremely muddy. The water comes in three directions onto the junction at the start of the lane. The water travels down the easiest route, and does not drain off the road into the drainage system. Water is also coming down a footpath from the Downs onto the lane and increasing the amount of water on the road.</p>		
Brief description of proposed works or activity		
<p>The main drainage area needs to be repaired and jetted. Recently a car drove into it, and it is not draining away at all now. The ditch draining into this area from above needs to be cleared enough and the water needs to be diverted off the road into this ditch. Below this area, the water needs to flow away into the system. The pipes under the road are silted up, and are not flowing freely into the main stream that will take all the surface water away. There is also a grassy island at the junction, and the pipes under it to remove the water, are blocked. The island, in which the local people take a pride, and which has been planted with snowdrops by the local people is now a muddy mess</p>

The Parish Council have spent £9,754.24 restoring the Pill Pond. They would be asking for the match funding for the road improvements.

The Parish Council have recently renovated the Pill Pond, and this lower land is the access route to it. Currently it is pooled in water, and only accessible in the right footwear.

The Pill Pond is a historic and beautiful area. There was probably a mill there in Roman Times, and the stream runs through the area from the chalk springs above. The wildlife is numerous, and we have the support of SDNP Ranger for this unique site. Local people were concerned about it increasing the flooded area, but a weir was inserted, and seems to have had an excellent effect on the control of the water. The most vulnerable house is very satisfied that the renovation has not increased the flow of water above her property. Further down the stream however, there is water coming down a track from the Downs, which does not go into the drain on the footpath. From that point on, the road is in a poor state, but most of this water is coming off the roads. At the other end of the lane.

Bury Parish Council decided to renovate the Pond and received only a small grant from RSPB.

We would like to make sure the road water is draining off properly. Once the storm ditches have been cleared, it would be possible for the local residents to clear them with spades in future to keep them running.

We run an annual spring clean which mostly involves cleaning highway verges.

This part of Clappers Lane has been a longstanding area of concern within the community and has been an ongoing point of discussion between the Parish Council and WSCC Highways. At present there is a narrow culvert, which frequently blocks with silt, thus discharging the water on to the Highway. The culvert is covered by a bank and trees. The trees would be felled, roots cleared and bank removed and the culvert would be replaced by a ditch (thus continuing the ditch that exists either side of the culvert. Grips to be cleared and new grips created as necessary.

Gully Works

- Carry out CCTV & jetting Survey of culvert under trees and clear gully on opposite side of road and jet link to ditch
- Raise existing gully grate to level

Lower lane in West Burton is frequently flooded. The water sits on the road and is extremely muddy. The water comes in three directions onto the junction at the start of the lane. The water travels down the easiest route, and does not drain off the road into the drainage system. Water is also coming down a footpath from the Downs onto the lane and increasing the amount of water on the road.

Brief description of proposed works or activity

The main drainage area needs to be repaired and jetted. Recently a car drove into it, and it is not draining away at all now. The ditch draining into this area from above needs to be cleared enough and the water needs to be diverted off the road into this ditch. Below this area, the water needs to flow away into the system. The pipes under the road are silted up, and are not flowing freely into the main stream that will take all the surface water away. There is also a grassy island at the junction, and the pipes under it to remove the water, are blocked. The island, in which the local people take a pride, and which has been planted with snowdrops by the local people is now a muddy mess

The Parish Council have spent £9,754.24 restoring the Pill Pond. They would be asking for the match funding for the road improvements.

The Parish Council have recently renovated the Pill Pond, and this lower land is the access route to it. Currently it is pooled in water, and only accessible in the right footwear.

The Pill Pond is a historic and beautiful area. There was probably a mill there in Roman Times, and the stream runs through the area from the chalk springs above. The wildlife is numerous, and we have the support of SDNP Ranger for this unique site. Local people were concerned about it increasing the flooded area, but a weir was inserted, and seems to have had an excellent effect on the control of the water. The most vulnerable house is very satisfied that the renovation has not increased the flow of water above her property. Further down the stream however, there is water coming down a track from the Downs, which does not go into the drain on the footpath. From that point on, the road is in a poor state, but most of this water is coming off the roads. At the other end of the lane.

Bury Parish Council decided to renovate the Pond and received only a small grant from RSPB.

We would like to make sure the road water is draining off properly. Once the storm ditches have been cleared, it would be possible for the local residents to clear them with spades in future to keep them running.
