## **West Sussex Summary**



### **New Businesses July 2025**

- 607 new businesses incorporated. (12.8% increase from June 2025)
- 708 businesses dissolved or liquidated. (64.3% increase from June 2025)
- Net decrease of 101 businesses. (was an increase of 173 in June)

### **Claimants July 2025**

- Claimant count increased by 1% in West Sussex over the last month.
- The claimant count rate stayed the same at 3.1% in West Sussex, remaining the same as regional average of 3.1% and below then national average of 4.1%.

### **Universal Credit Claimants July 2025**

- Universal Credit claimants increased by 1.7% in West Sussex over the last month.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (196% increase). Higher increase than national (167%) or regional (179%) average.
- 15.2% of the 16-64 population in West Sussex are claiming UC, close to the regional percentage and lower than the national percentage of 18.1%.

### **Job Postings (Lightcast)**

Update: As of June 2025, we have revised the way we report job postings. Notably, there is a change in the reported figures due to the removal of the 'Staffing Companies' (including recruitment companies) parameter. Going forward, we will report data exclusively under 'Non-Staffing Companies'.

- In July 2025, there were 10,383 unique job postings in West Sussex, which is almost 23% lower than the same time last year.
- In terms of the top posted occupations over the last six months (February 2025 to July 2025), home health aide is the top posted followed closely by janitors/cleaners.










Number of new business incorporations and businesses dissolved/in liquidation by industry in West Sussex (Apr'25 - Jun'25)







Summary of Business Formation Trends in West Sussex

**Overall trend:** Over the past three months, a positive trend has been observed across all districts and boroughs. With the exception of the Wholesale, Transport, Freight and Storage, Media & Broadcasting all other industries have experienced a substantial increase in new businesses. This indicates a positive and encouraging trend across the broader economy.

#### Last 12 months:

- 6,797 new businesses incorporated.
- 6,188 businesses dissolved or liquidated.
- Net gain of 609 businesses.

### Last 3 months:

- 1,701 new businesses incorporated.
- 1,501 businesses dissolved or liquidated.
- Net increase of 200 businesses.

### July 2025:

- 607 new businesses incorporated. (12.8 % increase from June 2025)
- 708 businesses dissolved or liquidated. (64.3% increase from June 2025)
- Net decrease of 101 businesses.















**Claimant count rate change**

Summary of Claimant Count Changes in West Sussex, July 2025

#### Overall:

- Claimant count has increased over the last month by 1% (16,270) in West Sussex.
- Claimant count rate is 3.1% in West Sussex, remaining the same as regional average of 3.1% and below national 4.1%.

### Breakdown by district (Jun'25 - Jul'25): Increases:

- Adur (4.5%)
- Crawley (0.4%)
- Horsham (1.2%)
- Worthing (1.9%)
- Mid Sussex (5.1%)

#### Decreases:

- Chichester (2.1%)


- Crawley recorded the highest claimant count (3,700).

- Mid Sussex and Horsham had the lowest claimant count rate (2%).





Summary of Universal Credit Claimants in West Sussex, July 2025

#### Overall:

- In July 2025, numbers of Universal Credit claimants increased by 1.7% (81,111 total) over the last month in West Sussex.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (196% increase).
- Higher increase than national (167%) or regional (179%) average.
- The percentage of the 16-64 population claiming UC in West Sussex has risen to 15.2%, which is almost the same as the regional percentage and lower than the national percentage of 18.1% for the last month.

### **Employment status:**

- 40% of claimants were in employment in June 2025. Higher than national (34%) or regional (37%) average.
- Mid Sussex and Horsham has the highest percentage of employed claimants (almost 43%).

### **District-specific:**

- Mid Sussex had the highest percentage increase in claimants (215%) since March 2020.
- At June 2025, Arun had the highest number of claimants at 17,225.

**Note:** Employment/not in employment breakdown for July 2025 is not available.








## **Job Postings**










Summary of the job postings in West Sussex by Lightcast.

WSCC has access to Lightcast from which the numbers of job postings by occupation type, along with other information including skills requirements and job titles is available. In July 2025 there were 10,383 unique job postings in West Sussex, a significant reduction from the peak in June 2023 of 21,119 but still higher than the general levels seen pre-Covid. In terms of the top posted occupations over the last six months (February 2025 to July 2025), Home Health Aide is the most frequently posted role, making up the highest number of occupations followed by Janitor/Cleaner. The remaining occupations appear to be evenly distributed.



## **Mid-Year Population Estimates**





Summary of 2025 mid-year population estimates (2024 based)

Arun remains as the largest local authority population in West Sussex. The largest age groups in all local authorities continue to be the economic age group of 16-64. All areas except Crawley in West Sussex have a larger older population (65+) than younger population (0-15).



- In early August 2025, economic uncertainty was the most commonly reported challenge affecting turnover for trading businesses at 25%. For businesses with 10 or more employees, the most commonly reported challenge was cost of labour at 36%.

- 12% of trading businesses expect the prices of goods and services they sell to increase in September 2025.


