New Businesses January 2025

- · 607 new businesses incorporated.
- · 415 businesses dissolved or liquidated.
- Net increase of 192 businesses.

Claimants January 2025

- Claimant count increased by 3.8% in West Sussex over the last month.
- Claimant count rate remained at 3% in West Sussex, staying below the regional average of 3.2% and national 4.3%.

Universal Credit Claimants January 2025

- Universal Credit claimants increased by 1.3% in West Sussex over the last month.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (174% increase). Higher increase than national (150%) or regional (161%) average.

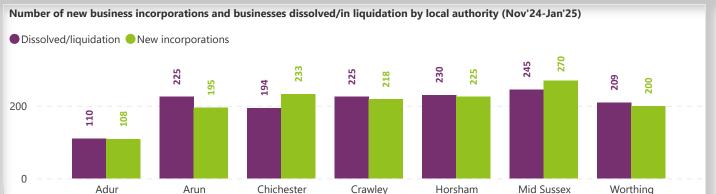












Summary of Business Formation Trends in West Sussex

Overall trend: In the last three months, Chichester and Mid Sussex have seen slightly more business openings than closures. However, the other regions have experienced slightly more closures. The sectors of business services, travel, personal and leisure, property services, transport, freight and storage, media and broadcasting, banking, and financial services have seen an increase in new businesses. Conversely, the rest of the services have seen slightly more closures.

- 5,521 businesses dissolved or liquidated.
- Net gain of 689 businesses.

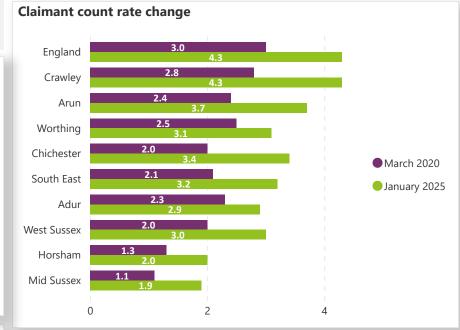


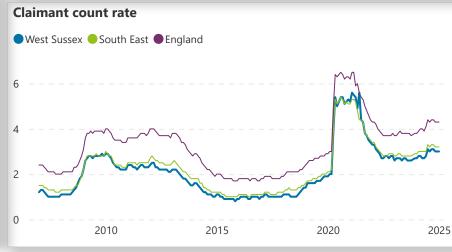












Summary of Claimant Count Changes in West Sussex, January 2025

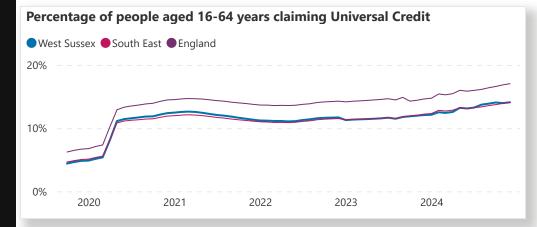

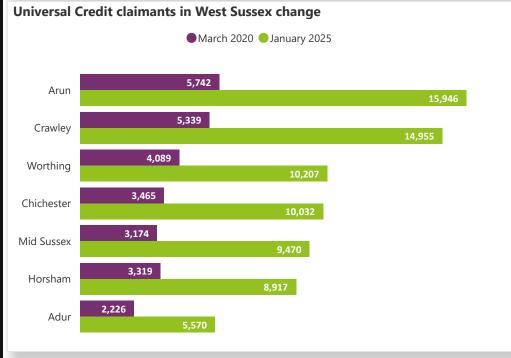

West Sussex: Universal Credit Claimants









Summary of Universal Credit Claimants in West Sussex, January 2025

Overall:

- In January 2025, Universal Credit claimants increased by 1.3% (75,097 total) over the last month in West Sussex.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (174% increase).
- · Higher increase than national (150%) or regional (161%) average.

Employment status:

- 43% of claimants were in employment in December 2024. Higher than national (37%) or regional (40%) average.
- Mid Sussex has the highest percentage of employed claimants (46%).

District-specific:

- Mid Sussex had the highest percentage increase in claimants (198%) since March 2020.
- At January 2025, Arun had the highest number of claimants at 15,946.

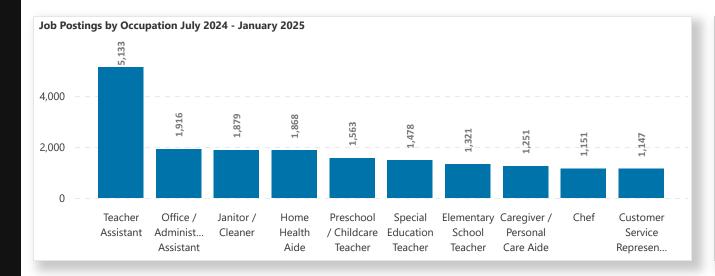


Job Postings









Summary of the job postings in West Sussex by Lightcast.

WSCC has access to Lightcast from which the numbers of job postings by occupation type, along with other information including skills requirements and job titles is available. In January 2025 there were 19,770 unique job postings in West Sussex, a significant reduction from the peak in June 2023 of 38,643 but still higher than the general levels seen pre-Covid. In terms of the 'top' posted occupations over the last seven months Jul'24-Jan'25 teaching assistants made up the highest number of occupations. Office/admin assistants and cleaners also continue to be in demand.

Job Vacancies

- Estimated vacancies in November 2024 to January 2025 was 819,000.
- Decreasing 9,000 or 1.1% from August to October 2024.
- Vacancy numbers decreased on the quarter for the 31st consecutive period in November 2024 to January 2025, with quarterly decreases in 11 of the 18 industry sectors.

- Payrolled employment slightly increased by 21,000 employees in January 2025.
- Early estimates for January 2025 indicate that median monthly pay increased by 5.7% compared with January 2024.
- Annual growth in median pay in January 2025 was highest in the accommodation and food service activities sector, with an increase of 10.4%, and lowest in the finance and insurance sector, with an increase of 2.9%.

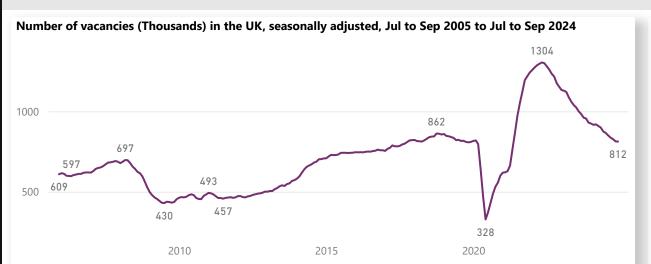

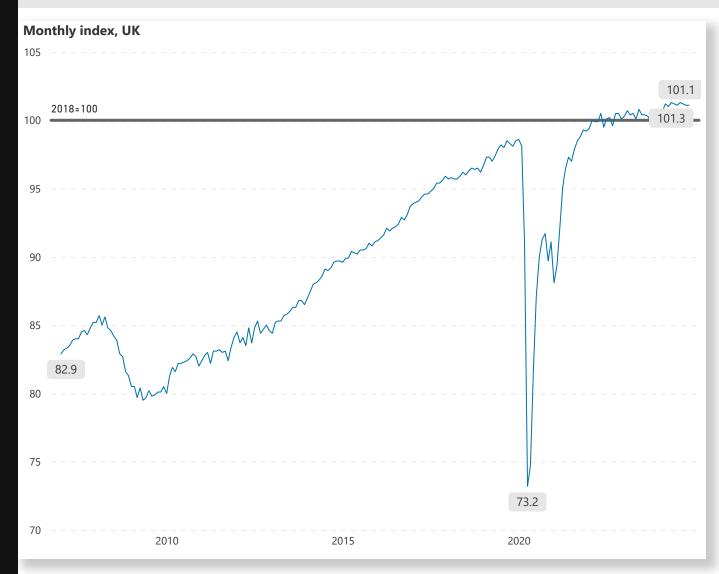

- ·16% of trading business reported their turnover had increased in January 2025 compared with December 2024.
- 22% of trading businesses reported that they expect their turnover to increase in March 2025.
- 13% of trading businesses reported that they expect their turnover to decrease in March 2025.
- •28% of trading businesses expect an increase in the prices of goods or services bought in January 2025.
- •13% of trading businesses reported an increase in the prices of goods or services sold in January 2025.
- · 46% of trading businesses reported they were not considering raising prices in March 2025.
- •65% of businesses reported some form of concern for their business.

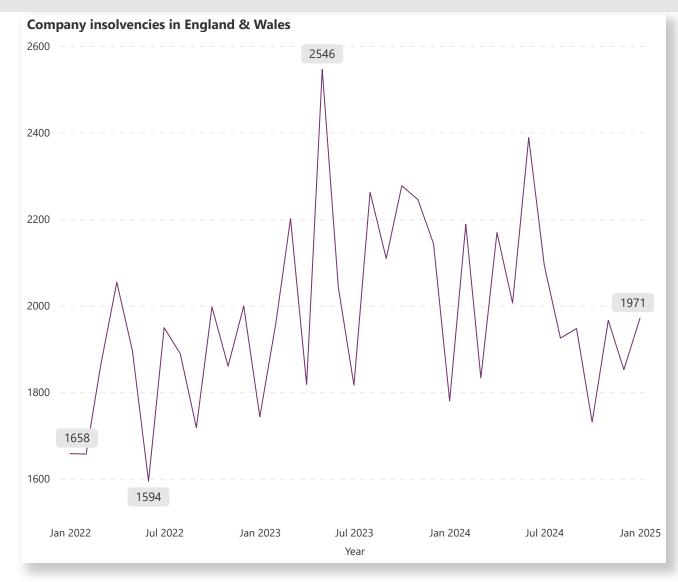

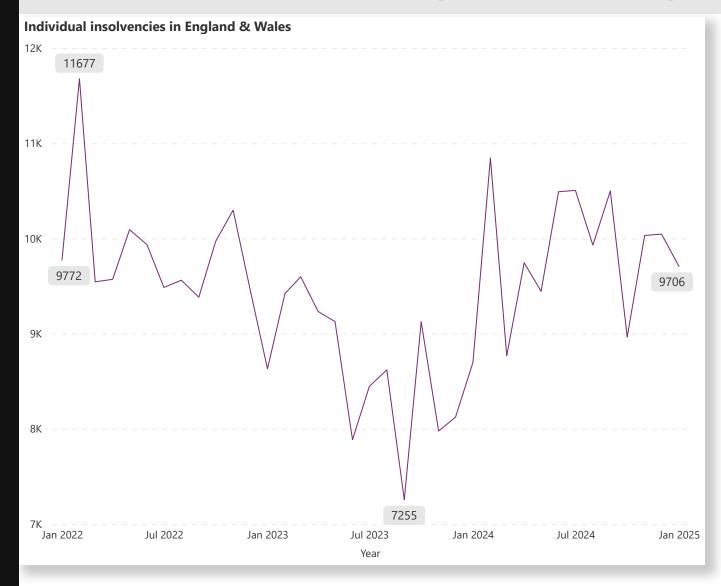
