Public Engagement Survey



Stakeholder engagement

A key part in developing the Strategy was undertaking engagement with stakeholders and the local community to both capture local knowledge of flooding issues and understand the aspirations for flood risk management within the relevant organisations and stakeholders. The information from these sources helped to develop the objectives, measures and actions.

Online public survey

An online public engagement survey was hosted on WSCC's engagement platform, YourVoice West Sussex, between 31 July and 27 September 2024. The survey was promoted using social media posts on Facebook, X, LinkedIn, and a press release, where analytics showed it reached 5,400 people. The survey was circulated to parish councils who held meetings to discuss the survey and their opinions.

The aim of the public engagement survey was to understand the local community's priorities for local flood management and to gather any additional flood incident data. The survey received 1,258 completed responses. Some of the key outputs of the survey are summarised below. The full summary report is included in the following section.

Key Facts and Figures

62.2% of respondents have been affected by flooding

When respondents were asked what flooding had affected them, the top three were as follows:

- Roads (737 responses)
- Local amenities (297 responses)
- Transport (273 responses)

The main sources of flooding in West Sussex are summarised as heavy rainfall (743), blocked or un-maintained watercourses (573) and blocked or overflowing sewers (499)

The survey indicated that 8.9% of respondents did not feel like they were provided with sufficient information after a flood incident from the relevant authorities (i.e. WSCC, Thames Water, Southern

Water or Districts and Boroughs), with 18.5% stating they received basic information and 69% stating they received no information.

Stakeholder engagement workshop

WSCC hosted two stakeholder engagement workshops, one to develop new objectives and the other to develop measures and actions. This involved most RMAs and the majority of key stakeholder organisations.

High-level outputs from the online survey were presented at the stakeholder engagement workshops to help to understand the wider interests of the community and inform the development of the objectives and measures for the Strategy.

The objectives workshop was held in July 2024 and provided opportunity for the stakeholders to share views on priorities and challenges. Following this, objectives were drafted and sent to stakeholders for comment. From this, finalised objectives were drafted and presented to the Task and Finish Group (a steering group of elected members at WSCC), prior to the measures and actions workshop, in September 2024.

The measures and actions workshop enabled discussion with a clear outcome to shape the priorities for local flood risk management in West Sussex. The objectives and measures for the Strategy were finalised following the stakeholder engagement workshop and through an online engagement platform (Miro Board), for further opportunity to comment. It was ensured that input from all stakeholders was included, and results of the public engagement survey had also been considered.










Q5 Thinking about the flood(s) you experienced in West Sussex, to your knowledge, what was impacted by flooding during these event(s)?








Q8 Which, if any, of the following provided information after the flood? (Please tick all that apply)






Q9 What do you believe are the main sources of flooding in your area? (Please tick up to two options)


Q10 In the future, which, if any, of the following ways would you prefer to find out about flooding and flood risk management? (Please tick all that apply)




Q11 Which, if any, of the following topics would you like more information on? (Please tick up to three options)






Q12 Which, if any, of the following do you currently do to prepare for flooding? (Please tick all that apply)









Q17 Which of the following age groups best describes you?







Q19 Do you consider yourself to have a disability or long-term illness?




