Guidance Notes

Note 1: Consent is required for any temporary works that obstruct or divert flow in an ordinary watercourse, even if the main works do not require consent.

Note 2: Consent is not required for any structures that are flush with or set back into the bank profile, as they do not reduce the channel's cross-sectional area. However, if the encroachment of the structure into the channel is unavoidable, consent is required.

Note 3: All culverting proposals must comply with the West Sussex County Council Culvert Policy.
