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West Sussex Summary



New Businesses September 2025

- 689 new businesses incorporated. (29% increase from August 2025)
- 599 businesses dissolved or liquidated. (27% increase from August 2025)
- Net increase of 90 new businesses. (41% increase from August 2025)

Claimants September 2025

- Claimant count increased by 2.5% in West Sussex over the last month.
- The claimant count rate increased to 3.1% in West Sussex, same as regional average of 3.1% and below national average of 4.1%.

Universal Credit Claimants September 2025

- Universal Credit claimants increased by 1% in West Sussex over the last month.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (202% increase). Higher increase than national (173%) or regional (185%) average.
- In August 2025, 15.4% of the 16-64 population in West Sussex are claiming UC, close to the regional percentage and lower than the national percentage of 18.5%.

Job Postings (Lightcast)

Update: As of June 2025, we have revised the way we report job postings. Notably, there is a change in the reported figures due to the removal of the 'Staffing Companies' (including recruitment companies) parameter. Going forward, we will report data exclusively under 'Non-Staffing Companies'.

- In September 2025, there were 10,943 unique job postings in West Sussex, which is almost 2.3% lower than the same time last year.
- In terms of the top posted occupations over the last six months (April 2025 to September 2025), home health aide is the top posted followed closely by janitors/cleaners.










Number of new business incorporations and businesses dissolved/in liquidation by industry in West Sussex (Jul'25 - Sep'25)







Summary of Business Formation Trends in West Sussex

Overall trend: Over the past three months, a mostly positive trend has been observed across all districts and boroughs with exception of Adur and Worthing. Construction, Wholesale, Retail and Transport, Freight, Storage, Manufacturing, Media and Broadcasting have seen a slight decline, all other industries have experienced substantial increases in new businesses. This indicates a positive and encouraging trend across the broader economy.

- Net gain of 641 businesses.

- 1,822 new businesses incorporated.











Claimant count rate change





Summary of Universal Credit Claimants in West Sussex, September 2025

Overall:

- In September 2025, numbers of Universal Credit claimants increased by 1% (82,819 total) over the last month in West Sussex.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (202% increase).
- Higher increase than national (173%) or regional (185%) average.
- The percentage of the 16-64 population claiming UC in West Sussex has risen to 15.4%, which is almost the same as the regional percentage and lower than the national percentage of 18.5% for the last month.

Employment status:

- 39% of claimants were in employment in August 2025. Higher than national (33%) or regional (36%) averages.
- Mid Sussex and Horsham have the highest percentage of employed claimants (41%).

District-specific:

- Mid Sussex had the highest percentage increase in claimants (228%) since March 2020.
- At September 2025, Arun had the highest number of claimants at 17,665.










Job Postings









Summary of the job postings in West Sussex by Lightcast.

WSCC has access to Lightcast from which the numbers of job postings by occupation type, along with other information including skills requirements and job titles is available. In September 2025 there were 10,943 unique job postings in West Sussex, a significant reduction from the peak in June 2023 of 21,217 but still higher than the general levels seen pre-Covid. In terms of the top posted occupations over the last six months (April 2025 to September 2025), Home Health Aide is the most frequently posted role, making up the highest number of occupations followed by Janitor/Cleaner. The remaining occupations appear to be evenly distributed.


