SECTION 53 OF THE WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR HORSHAM

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL (HORSHAM NO.1: SOUTHWATER
(ADDITION OF FOOTPATHS)) DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDER 2026

The above Order made on 17 February 2026, if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for Horsham by the addition of:

(1) A footpath commencing on footpath 1658 on the southern boundary of Courtland Wood at grid reference 515065, 127192 and proceeding generally north, then east, then north for a distance of approximately 653 metres before intersecting with footpath 1660 at grid reference 515335, 127630, with a varying width of 0.35 metres and 1.1 metres.

(2) A footpath commencing at grid reference 515317, 127518 and proceeding east, then northeast, for a distance of approximately 223 metres before intersecting with footpath 1660 at grid reference 515514, 127563, with a width of 1.1 metres.

(3) A footpath commencing at grid reference 515250, 127394 and proceeding generally east then south for a distance of approximately 313 metres before intersecting with footpath 1658 at grid reference 515365, 127276 on the eastern boundary of Courtland Wood, with a width of 1.1 metres.

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to the Director of Law, Assurance & Insight, County Hall, Chichester, West Sussex, PO19 1RQ or legal.services@westsussex.gov.uk (quote ref: CC803.16334) not later than **23 April 2026**. Applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any representations or objections to the Order will be kept on a file that is open to the public.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, and if any so made are withdrawn, the West Sussex County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it. (Objections will be held on a public file and while personal details will be omitted on request, they will become publicly available if and when the Order is sent to the Secretary of State).
